

Proof of Residency

A Business Names as LLC:

LLC must be registered with the Montana Secretary of State

The Agent for the LLC must have a physical address in the county of title and registration.

Businesses other than an LLC:

Businesses must be registered with the Montana Secretary of State

Exception – if a business is not required to be registered with the Montana Secretary of State

The Montana proof of residency will be the same as a resident registration (below)

Examples of businesses not registered with the Montana Secretary of State

Trusts – The grantor’s address determines where the vehicle can be titled and registered in MT.

MT Municipal Interlocal Authority – the business entity address determines where the vehicle can be titled and registered in MT.

Proof of Residency requires 1 Acceptable document. Acceptable documents must show Business name and physical address and be unexpired or dated within one year.

Acceptable Residency Documents

- Letter from local Geographic Information System (GIS) agency, for example 911 letter
- Bank statement or credit card statement
- First class mail with postmark
- Insurance policy
- Mortgage document
- Rental agreement or rent receipt.
- Tax document
- Utility bill showing the service address.

Businesses operating in Montana, but DO NOT HAVE A PHYSICAL LOCATION:

Example: Employees working from home:

The vehicle must be titled and registered in state where the business is located, and a registration purpose only (RPO) will be issued for the vehicle. Below is what will be needed:

- A current registration from the state the business is located.
- RPO can be purchased by the calendar quarter or annually.

Resident Registration: You do not have to have a Montana Driver’s License, but you do need to prove a current residency in the county that you are titling and registering the vehicle. If you do not have a Montana Driver’s License you will need the one of the following identification forms and a proof of residency as follows:

- Government issued photo ID.
- Out of state driver’s license
- Passport

Acceptable Residency Documents Showing a Current Residential Address:

- Letter from local Geographic Information System (GIS) agency, for example 911 letter
- Bank statement or credit card statement
- First class mail with postmark
- Insurance card/policy
- Voter Registration
- Rental agreement or rent receipt
- Tax document
- Utility bill showing the service address
- Pay Stub
- School Transcript or Report card

THE FOLLOWING CANNOT BE USED AS A RESIDENTIAL ADDRESS:

PO Box

Mailbox rental addresses (UPS store, Personal Mailbox number, PMB, etc.)

A resident cannot use a business address as a residential address.
